In exercise of the powers conferred by section 39 (3) of the Universities Act 2012, the Cabinet Secretary Ministry of Education has re-appointed Prof. Elijah I. Omwenga as the Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Academic and Student Affairs of the University of Kabianga for a second final term. Omwenga, a Computer Science Professor, has been the DVC (ASA) since August 2016.

Since his appointment, Professor Omwenga has made major strides in improving matters on the University's academic and student affairs docket

He has been instrumental in the coordination, development, review and accreditation of market-driven programmes that have been

accredited by the Commission for University Education. He coordinated the full implementation of the ERP modules on academic matters leading to efficient management and automation of admission and examination activities, through to graduation. He also revived and operationalized the juice and water processing and production plant, among other achievements.

On student matters, Professor Omwenga coordinated the development of student mentorship activities and through effective engagement with stakeholders, the

University has had its alumni association registered.

During the COVID 19 period, Professor Omwenga made strategic interventions in the implementation of eLearning mode of curriculum delivery that ensured continuation of teaching and learning at the University.
